Actions



- Increased use of low energy light bulbs, double glazing and a-rated appliances
- Systems to minimise waste and encourage recycling are in place
- Emphasis on using and promoting locally sourced produce
- All toiletries made from 100% recycled paper and all waste on site is composted and recycled if possible
- Introduced a bird hide to view the abundance of wildlife on the farm and provide a variety of bird and bat boxes
- Provide laminated copies of local walks to encourage guests to walk from the farm and a whole variety of information to encourage car-free activities
- Manage farmland through agri-environment scheme, which involves restoring and maintaining hedgerows and dry stone walls and restoring traditional farm buildings to maintain the historic interest of the farm
- Work closely with the RSPB to improve fields and hedgerows and have created a new pond and several scrapes which are providing more foraging areas for breeding wading birds
